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Q1: What is the program Exit Exam?

Answer: It is a standardized test conducted near the end of the program (before the start of the internship year) to assess the extent of acquiring program learning outcomes and the ability to integrate knowledge from various subjects to solve patient, family and community problems.






Q2: What is the importance of the program Exit Exam?

Answer: Direct measurement of the program's learning outcomes, preparation of students to enter professional exams, and fulfilling the requirements of employment agencies, as well as preparing graduates to engage in the labor market.


The college also grants certain privileges approved by the college council to students who pass this test with high rates.





Answer: The test is prepared by specialized committees of faculty members and consultants from the labor market and in the light of the tests of the Health Specialties Authority, which makes passing the program Exit Exam a good preparation for passing the professional test.





Answer: The program exit exam is conducted after the completion of the final year, during the internship year. A minimum of three months of internship training is required before a student is eligible to sit for the exit exam.





Q5: Will certain courses be specified for the program Exit Exam?

Answer: The program Exit Exam is concerned with measuring the student's cumulative knowledge and the ability to use and optimally integrate knowledge from all sources and all disciplines. Therefore, no specific courses are specified for the exam. The exam will be in all courses that were studied during the program period.





Q6: Is program Exit Exam compulsory?

Answer: Yes, entering program Exit Exam is required to allow intern student to enter the professional exam.







Q7: Is the failure to pass the program Exit Exam impede my graduation?

Answer: Failure to pass the program Exit Exam does not impede graduation, but passing it is necessary to obtain the advantages approved by the College Council, to obtain recommendations letter for postgraduate programs, and to prepare for professional examinations.





Q8: Will the college train me on the program Exit Exam?

Answer: Yes, introductory workshops will be held for students who are expected to graduate about the program Exit Exam and answer all questions.





Q9: Is it allowed to retake the program Exit Exam if it was not passed the first time?

Answer: The **pass mark** for the exit exam is **60% overall.** In the event of failure, the student is allowed to retake the exam after three months, with a maximum of **three** attempts permitted according to program regulations.





Q10: How can I know my performance in the program Exit Exam ?

Answer: All students will be informed of their exam results individually and confidentially.







Q11: what type of exams are required to the program exit exam?

Answer: The exit exam consists of both theoretical and practical components. The practical part is conducted in a clinical setting within the hospital. Passing the clinical exam in the hospital is a prerequisite for entering the theoretical exam. Furthermore, success in the theoretical part of the exit exam is a prerequisite for allowing the trainee student to register for the professional licensure examination.






Q12: How many exam questions in the theoretical part?

Answer: The theoretical exam consists of 200 questions, divided into two sessions. Each session lasts for 120 minutes, with a break of 30 minutes between the two sessions. The content covers all specialty courses in varying proportions, in accordance with the Saudi Commission for Health Specialties (SCFHS) blueprint.






Answer: The content covers all specialty courses in varying proportions, in accordance with the Saudi Commission for Health Specialties (SCFHS) blueprint, as follows:
